PFCU Reaches Out for the Thanksgiving Holiday

Philadelphia, PA, December 6, 2006 – PFCU is taking part in this year’s Thanksgiving holiday by reaching out to Emancipation For Women’s Annual Thanksgiving Food Drive.

In keeping with their pledge of working to better the communities that it serves, PFCU donated funds and volunteers to Emancipation For Women’s Annual Thanksgiving Food Drive. The Credit Union, in conjunction with EFW, provided the funds necessary to supply three major Philadelphia shelters with Thanksgiving dinner. They also volunteered their time to assist in loading and distributing the supplies to shelter representatives.

“We are forever thankful to PFCU for helping make Thanksgiving wonderful for the families that we were able to touch this holiday season,” said EFW CEO/Founder Lawanda Colon.

EFW estimated that the effort helped to feed over 300 people during the holiday. The shelters included in the food drive were the Philadelphia Emergency Center, the Act Recovery House, and Salvation Army’s Eliza Shirley House. The Reach For The Stars Youth Development Center donated their space for loading and distribution.

Emancipation For Women is a faith-based, non-profit organization geared towards domestic violence, established as a preventative program in Northern Philadelphia. Their mission is to provide a safe haven for Northern Philadelphia’s families and to educate men, women, and our youth.
