**PFCU Welcomes the Summer With Philadelphia Communities**

Philadelphia, PA, June 26, 2007 – This May, PFCU ushered in the warm weather and good times of the approaching summer season by taking part in several Philadelphia community days.

Among the events were Mount Airy Day, Fitler Square’s Spring Fair, the Spruce Hill May Fair and the Philadelphia Cares About Fairmount Park Day.

Both the West and East Mount Airy Neighbors Associations held their Mount Airy Day on Saturday, May 5. The annual neighborhood celebration takes place on the grounds of the historic Cliveden and Upsal Houses and includes vendors and tables from local business interests and organizations. PFCU employees from their Northwest Philadelphia branch were on hand to hear from community members, distribute free gifts and join in the fun. They also presented a sponsorship check for \$1250 to the Mount Airy Day Committee.

West and East Mount Airy Neighbors Associations both serve as community-based volunteer organizations committed to preserving and enhancing the quality of life in their richly diverse urban neighborhoods.

The following weekend, the Fitler Square Improvement Association held its 45th Annual Spring Fair to celebrate spring, the neighborhood, and Fitler Square Park. PFCU lent a hand by sponsoring a balloon sculptor and assisting with the White Elephant Booth. They also had employees on hand to meet and greet fairgoers, including Moola Moola, PFCU’s kids club mascot.

The Improvement Association helps to maintain and improve Fitler Square through a partnership with the City Recreation Department. All proceeds from the Fair support the ongoing maintenance of the Victorian-style park.

On the same weekend at Clark Park, West Philadelphia branch employees from PFCU distributed information and free gifts and spoke with visitors at the Spruce Hill Community Association's 49th Annual May Fair. The celebration included music, food, books, crafts and other items for sale, including games and activities for kids.

The Spruce Hill Community Association is a volunteer organization of neighbors committed to strengthening the Spruce Hill community and to enhancing the quality of neighborhood life for all residents.

Then, on Saturday, May 19, PFCU employees rolled up their sleeves and helped clean up parks throughout the Philadelphia area at the Philadelphia Cares About Fairmount Park Day. In partnership with the Fairmount Park Commission, Greater Philadelphia Cares mobilized volunteers to garden, plant trees, clean playgrounds and repair trails. From small community playgrounds to large major parks, no stone was left unturned.
