As nuclear weapons issues top headlines, this international dialogue explores practical action steps towards disarmament.

On Wednesday, October 22, 2008, The Project for Nuclear Awareness (PNA), in association with Chestnut Hill College, will present an *International Dialogue on Achieving a Nuclear Weapons-Free World** featuring Dr. Hans Blix. Dr. Blix, Chairman of the Weapons of Mass Destruction Commission, will be joined by Thomas Graham, Chairman of the Bipartisan Security Group, to discuss practical steps towards a world without nuclear weapons.
