

2008 PRO-AM GOLF TOURNAMENT: A BIG WIN
for Volunteers of America Delaware Valley

This year's tournament for Volunteers of America Delaware Valley attracted 100 golfers and netted \$62,000 for the nonprofit human services organization.

"It was successful by nearly every measure," says Dr. Lem Burnham, Senior Vice President of Development and Communications for the Collingswood, NJ-based organization, which operates 43 programs in Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware. The tournament was held on September 30th at Little Mill Country Club in Marlton, NJ.

"Little Mill is one of the greatest venues in South Jersey, and all of the golfers I spoke to were extremely pleased with the experience," Burnham adds. "Everything went off without a hitch. And the weather was great."

He singled out tournament committee chairman Douglas O. Tozour, owner of the King of Prussia-based Tozour-Trane, for his "superman" job, and the Philadelphia section of the PGA for its "exemplary" assistance.

Burnham made it a special point to apologize to those who were unable to participate this year due to a scheduling conflict implemented prior to him coming on board at Volunteers of America Delaware Valley. He assures all supporters of Volunteers of America Delaware Valley that every measure will be taken to avoid obvious calendar conflicts in the future.
