In 1976, Bill took out a personal loan and with the help of others, started the Sunshine Foundation and began making dreams come true for chronically ill, seriously ill, physically challenged, abused and truly deserving children nationwide. Today, Sunshine Foundation utilizes \$0.85 of every dollar to help a child's dream come true.
